

LEGISLATIVE HOT ISSUES

ISSUES -

VA BUDGET REQUEST 2014

The House and Senate Veterans Affairs Committees have both held hearings focusing on the FY 2014 VA Budget Proposal. The House and Senate Appropriations Committees are holding hearings today on Military Construction and VA Budget requests.

DOD BUDGET REQUEST 2014

The House and Senate Armed Services Committees have both held hearings focusing on the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) DoD Budget Request for FY 2014.

IMMIGRATION

EVENTS -

Staff participated in a Congressional Veteran Leadership Roundtable hosted by House Veterans Affairs Committee Chairman Jeff Miller. The Roundtable included members of the HVAC as well as representatives from various MSO's and VSO's. The majority of the discussion was relative to the VA Disability Claims backlog and VA leadership's inability to explain how they plan to reduce the backlog by 2015. Chairman Miller made it clear that the Committee will provide stronger oversight of VA and require VA Leadership to report milestones achieved in the attempt to reduce the backlog wait time to 125 days by 2015. The clear message from The American Legion was that VA and the Committee must understand the challenges at the Regional Office level. Before Central Office can actually improve the wait times they must hear directly from the Service Officers and VA Regional Office staff.

Staff met with Frank DiGiovanni, Director, Training and Readiness and Strategy, Office of the Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense, other senior Department of Defense members, and senior leadership of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters (IBT), to discuss progress made since February 2013 on our joint state-by-state initiatives, as well as tackling remaining barriers to credentialing service members and veterans.

Staff met with Beau Walker, Chief of Staff, Rep. Womack, to discuss the Legion's legislative agenda, along with allocation of appropriations to programs that address education, employment, and homelessness.

The American Legion was invited by the White House to participate in a bill signing at the Maryland State House with Governor Martin O'Malley and the First Lady. *The Veterans Full Employment Act* which Requires specified licensing units and boards to give credit to former service members for relevant military training, education, and experience in connection with the issuance of occupational and professional licenses, certificates, and registrations; repealing and re-codifying provisions of law regarding the renewal of occupational or professional licenses and the completion of continuing education or continuing competency requirements for specified members of an armed force deployed outside the State. The American Legion was a key partner in the creation of this legislation and its passage. The Legion was the only VSO invited to participate in the bill signing.
