### Chaplain Steve's Spiritual Corner

Hello and God bless my fellow Legionnaires.

Going around our state and conducting my training at various districts, one topic seems to come up quite a bit. It is probably something that most don't like to talk about because it can be terrifying. That topic is suicide. I bring this topic up when i discuss one of the chaplain's qualification that concerns keeping things confidential between the individual and the chaplain. However, there might come a time when someone indicates to the chaplain that he/she is going to do harm to themselves or maybe others. This is a situation that you will have to tell someone about and must be taken seriously. This situation is an emergency and it is imperative that you contact 911 immediately. You must inform your chain of command beginning with the Post Commander. If there's no immediate danger, but the individual needs to speak to a trained counselor, call the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at (800) 273-talk (8255). Remember in dealing with situations like this never promise confidentiality. Keeping a secret keeps someone from getting the professional help they need. Contact the individual's physician or mental health provider.

Always take the threat seriously. Don't try to handle the crisis on your own. Be calm, supportive and listen, let the individual relieve anguish by talking. Be understanding. Don't let the person alone. If possible stay nearby until you are sure the individual is receiving professional care.

In my travels I have been asked many questions about The American Legion. The majority of them I can answer, but when I can't I will find the answer and let those individuals know.

Jim Brennan, Post Commander of Post 84 in Havana, FL presented the question to me, which I didn't know the specific answer. The question was when the Vietnam Veterans were first allowed to join The American Legion? Through my research and with the help of the Director, Howard C. Trace of our national Library and Museum Staff, I am able to respond to his question.

The first time Vietnam Veterans were eligible for membership was September 1, 1966 with the eligibility period beginning August 5 1964.

This was resolution #433 from the 1966 National Convention. Below are the dates of eligibility changes for the Vietnam Era. Included are the resolution, Congressional action, and eligibility dates as they were when passed.

1966 National Convention Resolution #433

Public Act 89-550, September 1, 1966

5 August 1964 – Open

1974 National Convention Resolution #3

Public Act 93-557, December 27, 1974

5 August 1964 – 15 August 1973

1977 National Convention Resolution #249

Public Act 95-346, August 17, 1978

5 August 1964 – 7 May 1975

1997 National Convention Resolution #1

Public Act 105-110, November 20, 1997

28 February 1961 – 7 May 1975

Many people use the two terms interchangeably when they see a flag flying below the very top of a flagpole. However, there is a distinguishable difference between the two terms.

Half-mast is the term used to flying a flag midway between the summit and bottom of the flagpole on a ship, with the 'mast' in 'half-mast' being derived from the ship's mast. Half-mast is reserved primarily for ships when flags fly halfway during times of distress or mourning.

### John Dollinger POW/MIA Chairman POW/MIA Update

During the American Legion National Convention a review of the POW/MIA program included:

Update on the Congressional mandate to staff and identify 200 POW/MIAs a year by 2015. This included moves in Hawaii to accommodate larger JPAC staff and the addition of a Laboratory Annex at Offutt Air Force Base in Nebraska to identify remains

Explanation of new techniques used to identify remains.

A discussion of the GAO report on duplication of efforts in the POW/MIA community. There were nine (9) recommendations, including possible options for an accounting community reorganization.

Developments at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific (Punchbowl) and the efforts to identify the remains in the common grave sites.

Information was presented on the issues facing JPAC in Vietnam due to the high acid level in the soil and the passage of time making identification of remains difficult.

Navy Yard opens the door for us to speak a bit about fire arms and security at our Posts. Remember, in our preamble we pledge to maintain law and order.

Don't worry, no lecture on the political discussions on gun-control, we are a non-political organization. As veterans, regardless of service branch, we all have been trained in the use of firearms and many of us choose to continue our familiarity and ownership of firearms by possessing a Concealed Weapon Permit in the State of Florida. When coming out to your Legion Post to attend a program event, meeting, or social event, your concealed weapon should stay secured in your vehicle and should not be brought into the Post. Hopefully your Post has such language in your House Rules especially if you have a canteen or bar in your Post. We should never assume that "something like that could never happen here," because it can! Remember in the past year or so here in the state of Florida when there was a shooting resulting in deaths outside another Veterans Service Organization (VSO) during a poker run? Bet they thought nothing like that would ever happen there either. Possessing a CWP and owning firearms are a right of choice in this state and nation but the inside of an American Legion Post is no place for them. Lock it up in your truck, car, or your side bags, then come into the Legion building for some safe family fun and a successful event!

To local Post Law and Order Chairman. Ever wonder how to invite a law enforcement officer or fire fighter/paramedic to compete for the annual awards by the Department of Florida? Watch your local news. What better way to learn of the heroism displayed by your local first responders! We read about the good things these people do all the time, save the articles and then when the time for award submissions come make sure the supervisors of those you read about get the application and instructions on how to complete them. There will be more detailed information coming out in the 'Link' and in the mail to you for the application process and the deadline of May 1, 2014 for submission of nominees for the Department Awards. The time leading up to May should be used to start identifying local first responders that deserve to be submitted for these awards, and there is no better way that to stay in touch with local news about first responders in the cities and counties around your American Legion Post.

September 9-11 I was in Washington, D.C. for our National Commander's testimony before the joint committees of the House and Senate Veterans Affairs. Accompanying me from Florida was our State Legislative Chairman, Paul Martel, NEC Dennis Boland, PNC Clarence Hill, Department Commander Art Schwabe, Department Adjutant Michael McDaniel, PDC Fletcher Williams, PDC Phil Hearlson, Ron Musselwhite and Gerald Clark.

In the National Commander's speech were seven major items:

- 1. Shielding veterans and the Department of Defense from harmful budget cuts.
- 2. Opposing further increases in Tricare fees, including prescription drugs fees.
- 3. Properly funding the VA to ensure quality Health care and benefits for Veterans
- 4. Providing quality education through the Post 9/11 G I Bill
- 5. Assisting veterans with jobs
- 6. Eliminating VA claims back-log
- 7. Protecting the American Flag

After that meeting we all spent the next two days visiting all 27 members of the House and our two Senators. We made sure they knew what we were there for. Now it's up to our members to contact their Congressman and ask them to support our Legion Agenda.

### **BLOOD DONOR CHAIRMAN**

### **Bob Koger**

Fellow Legionnaires, do you know that the American Legion Blood Donor Program is probably the least expensive American Legion program in which your post can participate?

Least Expensive? Yes, least expensive, but my fellow legionnaires, the blood donor program is probably also the most urgently needed, most humanitarian, patriotic program your post could possibly support.

Urgently Needed? According to a report made public by the American Red Cross this past July, blood supplies have dropped to dangerously low levels in the United States. Nationwide, 17,000 pints of blood must be collected every day to meet medical demands, but during the month of June alone, 50,000 fewer pints were donated than is required to maintain a safe inventory. Presently, the nationwide blood inventory stands at only half the blood products that were in supply this time last year, resulting in a plea being transmitted nationwide for donors of all blood types, so I ask of all of you, please consider stepping up and make a blood donation to help maintain our blood inventory at a safe level.

Humanitarian? Every pint of blood you donate can save up to three lives, and all anyone has to do is just look around and they will see that there are thousands of small children suffering from brain tumors, leukemia, and other forms of cancer and illnesses that need thousands of pints of blood every day to help them live. There are hundreds of work place and auto accidents every day that require thousands of pints of blood. There are thousands of seriously ill patients in hospitals throughout your community, our state and nation that depend on people like you to make blood donations so they might survive.

Patriotic? At this moment throughout our communities, our state, our nation, and the world there are some 20 – 25,000 of our young military soldiers with severe wounds and unimaginable burns suffered in battle in Iraq and Afghanistan that need thousands of pints of blood and blood products every day to help them recover to an active, independent, and fulfilling life.

Remember, fellow legionnaires, all this blood and blood products that are so desperately needed can only come from someone like you; it cannot be artificially manufactured. It takes only 30 - 45 minutes of your time every two months to make blood donations. Is that asking too much of oneself to save someone's life?

In most instances, your blood donation will save the life, or at least help someone you will most likely not know. On the other hand, heaven forbid, you or a member of your family, before this day is over, may be in need of a lifesaving blood transfusion.

As the Department Blood Donor Chairman, I hope every American Legion post in the great state of Florida will make a sincere effort to recruit a blood donor chairman for your post, and encourage your membership to participate in regularly scheduled blood drives. Any blood bank in your area will be more than happy to help you set up a blood bank account for your post and help you schedule blood drives.

This past year, only 75 out of 290 posts statewide had a blood donor chairman and actively participated in blood drives. Folks, I know we can and only hope we will far exceed that number this year.

Several posts have told me that they do not have enough members to have a blood drive. Even with a small membership, a post can still set up a blood bank account for their post, and motivate their eligible members to donate blood. You never know when someone from your post might have an emergency and need to tap that blood bank account for a life-saving transfusion.

Only 3% of the people eligible to donate blood actually donate on a regular basis. In regards that, I ask this question: are you going to just sit back and be one of the 97% who are unwilling to make a blood donation to save a life, or are you going to be a hero and join the 3% who unselfishly donate their blood on a regular basis. Remember the life you save could yours or one of your loved ones.

I sincerely urge you, become a hero; join that 3% and save lives. You will be extremely glad you did. For God and Country

### VA Announces Award of Patient-Centered Community Care Contracts Contracts Provide Expanded Access to Community-based Care

WASHINGTON -- The Department of Veterans Affairs announced today that Veterans will have greater access to quality health care through a new initiative: Patient-Centered Community Care (PCCC).

"PCCC is an innovative solution that helps VA medical centers continue to provide quality care efficiently," said Secretary of Veterans Affairs Eric K. Shinseki. "This will be a valuable option for VA medical centers to use to expand our Veterans' access to care."

Under PCCC, VA medical centers will have the ability to purchase non-VA medical care for Veterans through contracted medical providers when they cannot readily provide the needed care due to geographic inaccessibility or limited capacity. Eligible Veterans will have access to inpatient specialty care, outpatient specialty care, mental health care, limited emergency care, and limited newborn care for enrolled female Veterans following the birth of a child.

"PCCC provides a regional contracting vehicle for VA to work with local community providers to give Veterans access to high quality care," said Dr. Robert Petzel, VA's Under Secretary for Health. "It will also help VA in our continued efforts to ensure timely and accessible services are provided to Veterans for non-VA medical care."

In total, VA has awarded two contracts under PCCC, one to Health Net Federal Services LLC and another to Tri-West Healthcare Alliance Corp. These companies will set up networks in six regions covering the entire country. VA expects to have these regional contract networks available to its medical centers by the spring of 2014. The awarded contracts, estimated at \$9.4 billion, include one base year and four option years.

PCCC is part of the overall Non-VA Medical Care Program. It will provide all VA facilities with an additional option to purchase non-VA medical care when required Veteran care services are unavailable within the VA medical facility or when the Veterans benefit from receiving the needed care nearer to their homes.

Among the many benefits to the Veterans and VA under these new contracts, VA will enjoy standardized health care quality metrics, timely return of medical documentation, cost avoidance with fixed rates for services across the board, guaranteed access to care, and enhanced tracking and reporting of non-VA medical care expenditures over traditional non-VA medical care services.




