

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THE CULTIVATION OF FUTURE AMERICAN LEADERS

The American Legion's Americanism Commission continues to foster and enrich the lives of young men and women – a responsibility it has been upholding for decades. More than 170,000 young men and women participated in Americanism youth

programs in 2014. Participants learned important values such as leadership and citizenship through Boys State, Boys Nation, American Legion youth programs will continue to enjoy robust participation as they produce the next generation of law enforcement officers, political leaders, entertainers, Major League Baseball players, astronauts and high-profile public servants. After all, molding today's youth into the leaders of tomorrow is a founding premise of both Americanism and The American Legion as an organization.

The Youth Cadet Law Enforcement Program is the most recent addition to Americanism's portfolio of youth programs. Founded in 1985, the program provides a week's worth of hands-on education sessions to young men and women on the importance of law enforcement and the day-to-day life of an officers. It was transferred from the National Security Commission to Americanism in 2011, and continues to teach young people respect for law enforcement while giving them a glimpse of an average day's work for a police officer or state trooper. Currently, 17 American Legion departments operate Youth Cadet Law Enforcement programs.

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All Posts should check to see that their Constitution and By-Laws are up to date, and in compliance with the new Department Constitution and By-Laws that are in the Legion Roster you recently received from Department Headquarters.

If by chance your Post Constitutional and By-Laws are not up to date, you should make the necessary changes and submit them for approval. Remember that any changes must be first approved by your Post membership in accordance with the Amendment process in your Constitution and By-Laws.

A rule of thumb is Posts should update their Post Constitution and By-Laws every three years.

I also receive questions, emails, and phone calls regarding problems with the Post Lounge. Be advised that the American Legion does not recognize the Lounge, Bar, Club Room, etc. as being a part of the Post. Posts

Basic Post information needed: Namesake, Post Picture, Webpage URL, Facebook URL, Youtube URL, 1st Commander Name, Notable members, any historical tidbits (like history of Post's name or location, etc.).

I want to really thank the following Posts for their great updates on the Centennial website: Post 0019 Orlando, Post 0024 Bradenton, Post 0054 Fernandina Beach, and Post 0063 Winter Garden. Great job! Everyone can check these out to get ideas for your own Post shell updates! For those who are not currently managing your own Post shell, please do not create a new shell for your Post – I will make you the Administrator of the current shell out there, just contact me.

There are 169 Posts that do not have an associated "Post Picture" – if one of these is your Post and you have a picture, let me know. I can scan and input this, or if you have digital you can email this to me. If your Post does not have a "Post Home", you can send a picture of something relevant to your Post that would showcase what it means in the community – i.e., a picture showing support of one of the Post Programs such as the Baseball team and Post members, signage, old Drum & Bugle Band photos, Parade pics with Post Members/Cars/Floats, etc. This gives a more meaningful touch to the Post's presentation on the website.

I also want to send out 'kudos' to those who proudly represented the Department of Florida as they joined me working the national convention floor as National Assistant Sgt. At Arms; Bill Hoppner, Jim 'Radar' Henry, and Loretta Young. Next year join me as a volunteer in Cincinnati to proudly represent the Department of Florida on the floor of the National Convention so please consider volunteering! You will be rewarded with a pin, meeting dignitaries from all over the country, and from foreign lands, and you will experience things that most delegates on the floor don't have a chance to experience. Most importantly, all delegates and guests that you encounter will see that Florida orange on your cap, and that what it is all about, service to others and pride in our Department.

Since the start of the membership year I have been busy as Department Sgt. at Arms and I love it! I have provided two Sgt. at Arms classes reaching over 45 members in the 5th and 16th Districts. I was also honored to be an instructor at the Florida Legion College in July. In October I made a return trip back to the Florida Highway Patrol Academy with Bob Brewster and PDC George Wehrli to discuss development of the Youth Law Cadet Program, an initiative started last year by Past Commander Conti when I was Department Law and Order Chairman. FHP has developed a great new program for the Department of Florida and they made a presentation including an impressive video about the program at the Fall Conference. During the Fall Conference in November I held another Sgt. at Arms class as well as instructing the American Legion Extension Institute (ALEI). I would be happy to provide either class to any Post, District or Area, just contact me at Sgt-at-arms@legionmail.org. I have also identified four short U.S. Army instructional videos about basic Honor Guard maneuvers, a great refresher course or a basic training tool for a Post starting a new Honor Guard. I can e-mail you those videos, just ask.

Now let's take some time to review American Legion uniform cap etiquette. Sometimes we forget the basics so it is worth reviewing the basics from time to time.

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district, or state lettering. (When you un-cover and lay the cap down, always lay it down with the American Legion emblem side up).

- * If desired, the following items must be placed on the right side of the cap:
- o Additional lettering, restricted to either the name of a Post or to an officer title, such as Past Commander
- o Cap insignias or badges for past or present officers
- o Consecutive membership insignia, membership stars, and/or authorized Legion or military service decorations
- * Names or nicknames of individual members cannot be used on caps.
- * The Legion uniform cap should be worn by its members only when in attendance at official Legion meetings or ceremonies or as official guests at patriotic or other civil functions or by individuals when officially representing The American Legion on public occasions.
- * A member is considered to be in uniform if wearing an official Legion uniform cap. Therefore it is not proper to wear the cap while eating a meal at an official Legion or civic luncheon or dinner. Most can expect to pay a fine small fine if you forget this one!
- * The cap should be worn in a place of worship only by the Guard of Honor, Color Guard, and Commander of same while in marching order or standing guard. When returned to and seated in pews, the cap should be removed.
- * Legion posts marching in formation into a place of worship should uncover at the door, hold the cap with the right hand over the heart until the arrival in the pews and commanded to take seats, remaining uncovered during the entire service. At the close of the service, upon command, the post shall arise, the members holding the cap with the right hand over the heart will march out of the place of worship and recover after marching through the door.
- * Legion members not in formation will uncover upon entering the place of worship and remain uncovered during the entire service and will recover after leaving the place of worship.
- * When at a funeral, the cap should be held over the heart as one approaches the casket and is not at any time worn in a place of worship (except by the Guard of Honor, Color Guard, or Commander of same while in marching order or standing guard.) At the graveside, the cap should be held in the right hand over the heart during the entire service. In cold and inclement weather, the cap should not be worn.
- * In Legion meetings, the cap should be worn except during moments of the Pledge of Allegiance, prayer, and when standing in silent reverence in memory of departed comrades, when the cap should be held with the right hand over the heart.
- * Female members of the Legion should wear their caps in the manner prescribed for female personnel of the armed services.



Public Relations-it is all about image-how you come across to the public. When you hear the word "Lexus" what do you think: Luxury and quality? When you hear the word McDonalds-you think something else.

Wall Street Journal? Penny saver? Each of these "institutions" project a certain image and attract a certain audience. What is the Image of your American Legion Post? In some communities, the Legion has no image because no community programs are conducted. In other towns, members of the Legion are Champions on social issues and pillars of the community. Still others may view a Legion Post in their town as a watering hole for older veterans without offering much to Iraqi/ Afghanistan veterans and families.

Each public perception is its reality. It is what it is. You should constantly review your Post standing on the image meter. Ask a Reporter how they perceive your Post. Winter Park, Post 112 is a good example. They have developed an excellent rapport with media and get very good coverage. If your Post is successful in obtaining results, share these ideas at your District meetings.

When we plan an event, who do we target as our audience? Do we really reach the people we needed to reach? Who came? It is up to you to make Public Relations important in your Post. If you are known to be exclusive to your own tight group, others won't be inclined to stop by. Think about how you come across.

If you are known to reach out and help other veterans, you will attract Veterans who want to do the same. Public Relations will have an impact on everything you do in your Post and everything you do in your Post will somehow impact your Public Relations. My fellow legionnaires, **now** is the time to start making contact with your local schools and letting them know of this opportunity to recognize students at the end of the school year. Hopefully by now our District Commanders and post commanders have identified an ambassador of the American legion to be the liaison with your local schools. The American Legion is an organization dedicated to

the service of God and Country. We believe that one of the best ways to perform this service is to take an active interest in the preparation of our youth so that they will carry on the tradition of patriotism and become freedom-preserving citizens. It is in this interest that The American Legion School Awards Plan was born and is maintained on a National level through The Americanism Commission of the American Legion. With so many changes in our communities and their lack of supporting our shared values of duty, honor, and commitment to God and country, it is very important to recognize our youth who are guided by the highest ideals and on the right path.

The American Legion School Medal is the highest honor awarded presented to Youth by the American Legion. It is a medal that proclaims they are kind of boy/girl that we believe worthy of such an honor. Your Post Commander needs to appoint a committee of not more than three members to contact local school authorities. When this has been done, it will be possible to run a coordinated program with the school and legion to ensure a quality candidates are awarded at the end of the year. With the upcoming holidays approaching and schools being closed for break, it is very important to get this interaction happening. Before you know it, the school year will be coming to an end.

In working with school administrators, it is important to explain the details on how the recipients are to be selected and selections should be made well in advance of the elections. Members of the graduating class and the faculty are to cast secret ballots to determine the boy awardee and the girl awardee. Traits underlying the selection of the boy and the girl will be Courage, Honor, Leadership, Patriotism, Scholarship and Service. Ensure that the voters understand the meaning of the qualities and their weights in the selection. The Post Committee upon the recommendation of faculty members and school administrators are charged with making the final selection.

The sole purpose of the undertaking by The American Legion is the cultivation of high character and wholesome ideals in youth approaching active citizenship. No trace of politics, sectarianism or favoritism should be allowed to attach itself to the School Award Program. Awards shall be made to the boy and to the girl of the graduating class in elementary, junior and senior high schools and colleges. Awards are limited to the graduating classes because of the candidates' positions on the threshold of entrance upon a more extensive period of education, or upon entrance into the wage-earning world.

The Department of Florida American Legion financial report of the end of the fiscal year 2015 (June 30, 2015) showed a loss of \$53,391.98.

For those of you that attended the Fall Conference you know that our Boys State Program is having financial problems because Florida State keeps increasing our

cost per boy for housing and meals.

The Finance Committee has worked very hard to come up with the funds to help the Boys State Board of Directors continue the program. The Finance Committee, along with the Department Executive Committee approved funds of \$53,700.00 for one year to subsidize this program. This will allow the Post to pay \$350.00 per boy this year as they have in the past with no increase. Florida State also has informed the Boys State Board of Directors that they increased the housing from \$16.00 per night per boy to \$23.00 per night. This means approximately another \$25,000.00 s going to be added to the bill. As far as food cost per boy they have not told the Board what that cost is going to be.

We hope that with the dues increase that has been approved, effective January 1, 2016 will help offset our losses.

On another Financial note: The Officers and Chairmen that are on a budget, the Finance Committee agreed that when you have reached your full budget, additional funds will not be available. Spend wisely.

The Finance Committee is also requesting each Post have a fundraiser or dinner to support Project VetRelief. This program is just getting off the ground and we need each Post to support this program which supports our Veterans in Florida. Be aware that the American Legion National Organization has gone into the fund raising business and will be sending out mail trying to raise funds. It is suggested that any mail you get asking for donations reads: Department of Florida American Legion with the Florida Legion logo.

The Finance Committee works hard to insure that the Department of Florida American Legion stays financially strong now and for years to come.

The Scholarships Committee has been mainly inactive so far this year. No applications have been received for review at this time. I expect we will begin receiving applications for Eagle Scout of the Year, General Scholarship, JROTC Cadet of the Year and Teacher of the Year applications to begin to trickle in after the first of the year.

I plan to touch base with Florida's six medical schools financial aid office to remind them of our three scholarships for third year medical students. Last year we had no applicants.

I have made post visits to Post 90, 103, 110, 123, 254, 323 and 274 in conjunction with Legion Riders events and have introduced myself with the leadership teams at each post. I also attended the District 13 Fall Conference meeting for the American Legion, Legion Riders and Sons of the American Legion. Lastly I attend the Department Fall Conference and completed the Post Services Officer training.

Attention to all Dept. Legislative Council Members,

The Legislative Department of the American Legion need help getting the Home Joint Resolution passed in Congress.

This was introduced by Rep. Steve Womack (AR) and is a proposed Constitutional Amendment to protect the American flag from physical desecration. Its text states simply: "Congress shall have power to prohibit they physical desecration of the flag of the United States."

Staff from the Legislative Division has met with the staff of Sen. Orrin Hatch (UT) to discuss the reintroduction of the flag protection amendment in the 114th Congress. Sen. Hatch has long been the champion of the amendment. Our efforts finally came to fruition on July 30th, when Sen David Vitter (LA) introduced Senate Joint Resolution 21, prior to the August district work period.

In addition to Rep. Womack and the five original co-sponsors of the House Joint Resolution, there are now a total of 36 co-sponsors. Additional co-sponsors continue to be sought for both measures. Of these co-sponsors, only one is from Florida, Jeff Miller.

A few years ago this amendment lost by only one vote.

All Council Members are urged to call their assigned members of Congress to co-sponsor HJR9. This is one amendment that does not cost anything out of the budget. You should also ask members of your Post and of any Post that is in your area to call their Congressmen as well.
