As I travel our great Nation and the Department of Florida, I have seen some people have their own agenda. For over 100 years, the American Legion has stood fast in serving

the four (4) pillars of The American Legion; Americanism. Children & Youth, National Security and Veterans Affairs. They are not just names, but programs that have fulfilled the lives of many veterans and children of our Nation.

We have a history that I believe no other service organization can duplicate.

- August 9, 1921, through The Legion's efforts result in the creation of the U.S. Veterans Bureau, forerunner of the Veterans Administration.
- December 15, 1943, Past National Commander Harry W. Colmery starts to write in longhand, on Mayflower Hotel stationery in Washington, the first draft of what later became the "GI Bill of Rights"
- May 39, 1946, The American
 Legion and the American Legion
 Auxiliary present a small, struggling
 organization called the American Heart
 Association with a \$50,000 grant.
- July 9, 1954, The American Legion

Child Welfare Foundation is formed. Today, more than \$18 million has been awarded to youth organizations.

- August 26, 1982, The Legion presents a \$1 million check to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund for construction of the Vietnam Wall.
- July 21, 1983, The Legion sponsors an independent study on the effects of exposure to Agent Orange on Vietnam War veterans.
- August 2, 1990, The Legion files suit against the federal government for failure to conduct a Congress mandated study of the effects of Agent Orange.
- June 11, 1997, The Legion's National Emergency Fund surpasses the \$1 million mark in cash grants given to flood victims who belong to the Legion family.
- October 17, 2003, American Legion efforts on Capitol Hill breaks the deadlock on the Disabled Veterans Tax.
- October 2007, By Resolution #35 the Legion adopts The American Legion Riders.
- October 2010, The Legion forms a PTS-TBI Ad Hoc Committee to both examine current methods by the VA and the Department of Defense.

The Legion continues in the tradition of our forefathers, serving our veterans and the children of our community, state, and nation.

One of the best tools for membership is myLegion.Org:

myLegion.org is a FREE website designed to connect members of The American Legion to their Post and Department leadership, myLegion includes a site at each level of the organization:

Members - allows members to view information on file at National Headquarters, view messages and events published through the department and post myLegion sites, and network with other myLegion members using networking tools.

Departments - provides membership information, reports and electronic membership tools such as data change

forms for all posts and squadrons within their department.

Posts/Districts/Counties - provides Legion and SAL information for all members in their post. Allows post to submit member data change forms and Consolidated Post Reports electronically. Upload post image, newsletter, message, and calendar. I also suggest that posts encourage every family member to take the Legion Institute Basic Training.

Assistance will be available at your request at all levels. It may include one on one, Post, District or Area Level Classrooms or round tables. Please contact me so that I can get you on the calendar.

Hello my fellow Legionnaires and family,

I would like to thank Commander Brandt for giving me the opportunity to continue serving this great department. I

look forward to a great year under his leadership. I want to thank Ray Perez for his work for the past two (2) years as the previous Blood Donor Chairman.

I have already been to two (2) post that have had blood drives this past month. If your post is hosting a blood drive, please send me an email at blooddonor@legionmail.org to let me know and I will try and come to the event.

Here are some facts about blood donations from the American Red Cross, https://www.redcrossblood.org/donate-blood/how-to-donate/how-blood-donations-help/blood-needs-blood-supply.html:

- Less than 38 percent of the population is eligible to give blood or platelets.
- Blood and platelets cannot be manufactured; they can only come from volunteer donors.

- The blood type most often requested by hospitals is type O.
- One donation can potentially save up to three lives.

Remember that this is a program with very work usually involved by the post volunteers. Normally, the post just needs to reach out to their local blood bank to schedule a drive at their location. One thing that I usually tell people is that when doing so, try and schedule it during an event to try and increase the possible number of donors.

Purpose of the Fund

"The Children & Youth Fund provides financial support to programs and projects that enhance the lives of children in the State of Florida. The organization that is seeking funding

must be well established in contributing to the physical, mental and emotional welfare of children throughout the community of which service is provided"

Funding Policies

- Funding is determined and provided by The American Legion Florida Children & Youth Fund Board of Directors.
- Funds can range to a maximum of \$5,000.
- Any Funds received will be a one-time allotment for the year; Funds are not renewable.
- Any Funds received must be used between August 1st to July 31st of the award year.
- All funds must be used directly to benefit the children of the State of Florida.
- If you receive a Grant, you must wait

two years before reapplying.

This year, the Directors approved two Grants of \$5,000 each. One to the Keystone Bills Booster Club in Odessa, Florida. Their Grant will be used to purchase football safety equipment for their youth athletes. The other Grant was given to Helping Enrich Autistic Lives (HEAL). HEAL will donate and deliver iPads and Trikes to local schools for Exceptional Student Education (ESE) programs throughout five school districts in Baker, Clay, Duval, Nassau and St. Johns counties.

It is an honor to help these applicants, who help the children of Florida.

Hurricane Season is Here

As of June 14, we have had four (4) tropical storms and a category 1 hurricane. Due to the storms coming earlier in the season the dates will be changed to May 15 through November 30 of each

year instead of June 1 through November 30. The peak of hurricane season is August and September.

We hear phrases like turn around, don't drown, hide from the wind, and run from the water. These are phrases used to explain

how dangerous a storm can be. They are self-explanatory and common sense. I can't express my concerns enough for the safety of all. Most of the injuries come after the storms. Using chain saws without ear and eye protection and proper instruction can be deadly. Generators are dangerous pieces of equipment that are used after a storm if not properly used. Carbon monoxide, is a colorless, odorless, tasteless gas is discharged by gas engines that operate your generators. They should never operating generators in a garage or inside your home.

They should be operated in a well-vented open area. That also goes for BBQ grills that give off toxic gases. Always treat down wires as live never take for granted that they are

dead.

Before a storm, you should have your Hurricane supply kit ready if you must evacuate. Also, have all your important papers in a watertight container. Use your phone to take pictures, and if equipped, take videos of all the rooms and garage for insurance purposes. If you evacuate, make sure you have these items and notify relatives of where you will be. As always, I can be reached at 305-968-7979 or by e-mail disasterprep@legionmail.org. 


