May is going to be a very busy month - DCC's and Memorial Day. With the scheduling of events in some districts on the same day at the same time it will be


impossible to attend all the DCC's this year. I will mail my endorsement to each Post.

If you're like me, you are starting to feel


the strain of two long years in the same office, dealing with the same issues and dealing with the insistent drama.

Hopefully, we can get through these next couple months without too many roadblocks in our way.



Operation Comfort Warriors (OCW)

OCW: \$181,769 in grants show recovering veterans The American Legion cares

The American Legion's Operation Comfort Warriors (OCW) program distributed \$181,769

in grants in 2020 that helped thousands of wounded veterans and their families through donations of rehabilitation equipment and comfort items, winter coats and clothing, food, TVs and more.

The following are a few examples of how OCW grants were able to assist others in 2020.

Winter Kits

 The American Legion Department of Indiana and Indianapolis Post 522 presented an OCW grant to the Hoosier Veterans Assistance Foundation worth more than \$17,000 in winter gear (coats, hats, gloves, and scarves), T-shirts and toiletries to help local homeless veterans during the cold months.

• Electronics

 Nine smart TVs were supplied to the Indiana Veterans Home in West Lafayette for its nearly 200 residents.

- A \$42,000 OCW grant provided 166
 43-inch Samsung smart televisions for the men and women to have in their individual rooms as they recover at the Warrior Transition Battalion Liberty Barracks at Brooke Army Medical Center at Fort Sam Houston, Texas.
- An OCW grant of \$18,000 provided 50 Apple iPads to the Minneapolis VA Health Care System to help connect inpatient veterans face-toface virtually with their loved ones during this ongoing pandemic.

Elliptical machine

While on a mission in Afghanistan, U.S. Marine veteran Joshua Barton was thrown from the vehicle he was in, affecting his mobility and mental health. Both Barton and his chiropractic doctor felt that to regain fitness and strength through cardio equipment that had low impact on the spine and knee, an elliptical machine would be the best option. OCW provided an elliptical to the home of Barton in Spring, Texas.

• LEGOs

 Medically retired U.S. Army Sgt.
 Adam Menin applied for an
 OCW grant in hopes of receiving therapeutic recreation items to assist with his combat-related injuries, including post-traumatic stress. Menin's request of architectural LEGOs, movies and video games were granted and presented to him inside his American Legion home of Post 64 in Sioux City, Iowa.

Food support

- An OCW grant of \$6,675 provided 375 meals for veterans during the Alaska VA Healthcare's first Veteran Appreciation Curbside BBQ event in Anchorage.
- o The American Legion Department of Indiana presented Aaron Robinson with a \$5,000 OCW grant to help cover the operating budget for his Greenhouse Garden Project as it continues to grow. The check will fund the greenhouse's operating costs for two years. The greenhouse at the VA Northern Indiana Health Care System is for Inpatient Psychiatric Unit veterans and other veterans with mobility issues to allow for patients to get outside and become more active by planting, growing, and eating fresh tomatoes, peppers, green beans, squash, zucchini and cucumbers.

Every dollar donated to The American Legion Operation Comfort Warrior program goes toward the comfort items and services that help servicemembers in their recovery.

If your Post is under the charter strength of fifteen (15) members, your Post is subject to discussion by the Department Executive Committee for the purpose of possible suspension or revocation of your charter.

As of April 7, 2021 - both the National Convention and the Department Convention are still being held. The Department Convention is on July 1st – 4th 2021, at the Marriott World Center, Orlando. For more information go to floridalegion.org, and look under events.

Department Convention is coming up, this is a great time to have the up-andcoming members receive knowledge and training. Topics include anything The training courses offered at Department Convention, and on Department and National websites, are important to help ensure a successful American Legion Post. During my travels to the twenty-three (23) counties of the Northern Area I have encountered a few Posts that do not routinely read the minutes of the previous E-board at the general post meeting. The E-board can make decisions, but their actions still need the approval of the general membership. Remember; the E-board does not run the Post, the Membership runs the Post.

It's that time of year again... elections!
Just a reminder, any legionnaire in good standing is qualified to run for any position in the American Legion... up to and including National Commander. I mention this to emphasize that it does not matter the age of the legionnaire or the length of time in The American Legion are qualifiers. If a legionnaire has the motivation and dedication to learn and serve, encourage them to strive and thrive. If a motivated and dedicated legionnaire is discouraged, especially by someone who they are looking to for guidance, you have basically just shoved them right

out of your Post and maybe even out of the American Legion! (This could be a reason a Post is not thriving or growing.) Never underestimate the potential of a motivated and dedicated legionnaire!

Please remember the following:

- Buddy Checks are about checking on the welfare of your members.
- To recognize and thank those legionnaires who have done a great job this year.
- Welcome Eligible Veterans with open arms and allow them to learn to take over your Post. Give them a challenge!

CPRs and Addendums are due to Department Headquarters no later than May 12, 2021. The CPRs can be completed by using MyLegion.org. The CPR Addendums can be downloaded from Department website. Department of Florida receives the Year End Reports, tallies them, and forwards the information obtained from them to National American Legion Headquarters. National gathers all fifty-four (54) Departments and they use this information when the National Commander goes to Congress. This is a BIG determination on how Congress, the President of the United States and the American People see the American Legion.

Let's finish the job with that final Push for Membership as of April 1, 2021, the Northern Area is currently at 93.02% of our Goal, with just 1,115 Cards away from reaching 100%.



Post Elections

There are a lot of questions about elections of post officers. The following is from the Department Constitution and bylaws.

1. The local Post shall be officered by the following officers who shall be elected annually by the Post: Post Commander, Post Vice-Commandersas many as may be required.

Post Finance Officer, Post Sergeant-At-Arms, Post Historian, Post Chaplain, Post Adjutant, Post Service Officer, and Post Judge Advocatewho shall be appointed by the Post Commander-elect and whose names shall be placed before the Post or the Post Executive Committee as the Post Constitution and By-Laws shall

- provide, at the first meeting following their appointment, for confirmation by a majority of the members present.
- 2. All officers of Posts, except the Post Adjutant, Post Service Officer and Post Judge Advocate, shall be elected and certified to the Department Adjutant, not more than ninety (90) days, nor less than ten (10) days prior to the Annual Department Convention, certification to be made on forms furnished or prescribed by the Department Adjutant.

Post Officers shall be installed by the District Commander or his/her designated representative.

Post Officers shall take office and enter upon their duties at a date to be fixed by the Post, which date shall be subsequent to, but not later than sixty (60) days after the adjournment of the Annual Department Convention, unless waived in writing by the incoming District Commander.

In the event of a vacancy caused by the death, resignation or removal from office, the name and address of the successor shall be reported to the Department Adjutant within one (1) week after such vacancy has been filled. No Post officer shall assume office prior to providing the Post Adjutant with proof of eligibility.

- 3. Ask members to renew, remember that membership is the life blood of the American Legion.


SACRIFICE is something we all do and is sometimes it is hard to make it happen.



easily access information regarding health services and much more. Additionally, the VA now offers outpatient, inpatient and residential services for veterans who have experienced Military Sexual Trauma. Help is available at all VA medical facilities and VA Vet Centers in the state. As Legionnaires we need to find ways to let veterans who want and need help know that help is available, and they don't have to be service-connected to receive it.

As a matter of valuable information, the VA has decided to cancel or refund copayment debts incurred between April 6, 2020 and September 30, 2021. This applies to both medical care received through the VA and prescription meds.

I've been lucky enough to have met some wonderful people who are dedicated to helping veterans with disabilities. I've learned that there's a little-known program approved by the VA to help treat those veterans with neuropathy, having a high degree of success. I will direct you to their website: www.neurolumen.com. Another organization is one which provides disabled veterans with specifically trained service dogs. Cost is extremely minimal (if special equipment is necessary) and they serve veterans of all wars and location within the state. Their website is: K9Line. org.

As a follow -up on an item from last month, The TEAM (Toxic Exposure in the Military) Act has now been re-introduced by two Senators. They are working with House Representatives to frame a bill that will be successful. Let's remember that every election cycle representatives ask for your vote and promise to look out for our interests. Do not be afraid to remind them of that promise because this Act provides care for our brothers and sisters who earned it through their service. Call your Congressmen/women and remember that they work for you.

Unlike this time last year, I'm happy to close this article by telling everyone that I look forward to catching up with everyone at our Convention in July.
