A Message from the Department Commander

Comrades, it's been another long month, beginning with the **National Spring Meetings** and ending with the Heroes Honor Festival, with a number of events in between. The year is winding down now,

as we are busy preparing for Department Convention.

While attending the National Spring NEC Meeting, I learned important information I would like to share with you:

- 1. Yes, The American Legion Department of Florida is still on probation with National. However, that probation will be lifted at the Department Convention with the passing of Amendments by the Membership. Those Amendments were reviewed and forwarded by the DEC in April to membership. All our Posts should have received them for review and final vote on the Convention Floor.
- 2. Dues to National were discussed during the Spring NEC Meeting. The National Executive Committee felt that fundraising was doing well, and no increases in dues by National were needed at this time.

3. National feels that the recognition of The American Legion Racecar has been successful for membership, recognition, and donations. Studies are ongoing to determine exactly how this recognition is paying The American Legion back, through donations and new members. Currently, there is no deadline for the final report on this study.

The above three items are my top take-aways from the meeting, other items did come up about the VA. Increasing access for our sisters to obtain better treatment in the VA hospitals, and "Burn Pits" exposure veterans have experienced were also topics of discussion. Both topics will be front and center for the VA and Congress to fix.

I am proud of the work that The American Legion, on all levels, do on behalf of our fellow veterans. Let us continue this important work well into the future.

You may have been hearing conflicting reports about the NEC Meeting, but you can listen and watch the meeting yourself. Videos are available on YouTube, search "American Legion NEC Spring Meeting, 2022" and you should be able to locate and watch the meeting. The information about Florida's Constitution and Bylaws is about 1:32 hours into the presentation, with the vote about 1:50 hours in. Please watch, and then you

Regarding The American Legion, Department of Florida Constitution and Bylaws, the DEC has approved Amendments to bring us current for National. However, the Constitution and Bylaws are still confusing to read. Your incoming Department Commander will have a committee tasked next year to continue work rewriting the Department Constitution and Bylaws. Most of the work has already been completed, and the information can be accessed by the committee to continue working. If you are asked to assist, please do so.

I usually do not mention membership, however at this time, we are about even with our numbers from last year. Please remember, those you have transmitted in, will not count for about two weeks after the transmittal. I would like to thank the Department and District Membership team for their hard work. You have all achieved a lot over the last few years, despite our many challenges: new mylegion system, COVID lockdowns, lockdown of our VA hospitals,

war in Europe, high gas and food prices, etc. Even with all of our challenges, you, our American Legion members, are not only surviving, but you are growing with almost 10,000 new members. Policy and procedures for the Temporary Financial Assistance Program

RESOLVED, By the National Executive Committee of The American Legion in regular meeting assembled in Indianapolis, IN, on May 4-5, 2022, that the statement of policy

governing the Temporary Financial Assistance hereby remain as follows;

A single one-time non-repayable
 Temporary Financial Assistance grant of up to \$1,500 may be permitted for the minor child(ren) of a qualifying veteran;

- A qualifying veteran is defined as a member of the united States Armed Forces currently serving on federal orders under Title 10 of the United States Code, inclusive of all components or any veteran possessing an up-to-date membership in The American Legion;
- A inquiry into and verification of the need, and cause of need, should conducted by a personal visitation to the home or other whereabouts of such child(ren) by a competent investigator(s);
- Formal documentation and/or a signed written testament of an investigator's statement of findings is required as part of the Temporary Financial Assistance investigation process, and verification that all other forms of financial assistance

- available have been sought and applied for, or have already been denied;
- Annual cumulative expenditures of Temporary Financial Assistance grants may not exceed \$700,000 without prior approval of each chairman of the Americanism and Finance Commissions and the national commander; and, be it finally

RESOLVED, That the Committee on Children & Youth, with review and concurrence of the Americanism and Finance Commissions, develop, maintain in writing, and review biennially (every two years) the conditions, rules, guidelines, and procedures for managing administration of the Temporary Financial Assistance program.

During World War II (1939-1945), the Battle of Normandy, lasting from June

1944 to August 1944, resulted in the Allied liberation of Western Europe from Nazi Germany's control.

Codenamed Operation Overlord, the battle began on June 6, 1944, now known as D-Day. Some 156,000 American, British, and Canadian forces landed on five beaches along a fifty-mile stretch of the heavily fortified coast of France's Normandy region. The invasion was one of the largest amphibious military assaults in history. By late August 1944, all of Northern France had been liberated. By the following spring, the Allies had defeated the Germans. The Normandy landings have been called the beginning of the end of the war in Europe.

Also, in June we celebrate Flag Day. Flag Day is celebrated on June 14, and commemorates

the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. We also celebrate Father's Day in June. Happy Father's Day to all of you Fathers!

Army State Marksmanship Competition at Island Coast HS, Cape Coral

Correctional Officers, The Unspoken Heroes

So far in 2022, there have been one-hundred and five Correctional Officers killed in the line of duty across the Country. Thirty-three in the State of Florida,

twenty-nine males and four females. Most of these cases were during the handling of inmates. Many of them were killed while transporting prisoners from one facility to another and even taking them to Court.

Some died in vehicle crashes, some were stabbed to death, and some (which is every Law Enforcement Officers nightmare) were killed with their own duty weapon. The difference between Correctional Officers killed in action and Patrol Law Enforcement Officers killed in action is the fact that the most danger they have on the street is the suspect having a hidden firearm. When that danger is over, and an arrest is made the suspect is transported to the correctional facility and handed over to the Correctional personnel. Law Enforcement Officer's job is over. Being in Jail now 24/7 means the inmate can plan ways to escape while attempting to a gain the trust of the Correctional Officers. This will many times

cause the Officers to "drop their guard". Things become routine. Thus, many surviving Corrections Officers state, "They never saw it coming".

I personally have never been a Correctional Officer but have learned to have a great deal of respect for them and the job they have chosen. Let us, as Legion family, and seek (by their uniform) a Correctional Officer out and thank them for their service too. They are to all of us "the unsung heroes" of the Law Enforcement Community.

Transfers

In the past few years, Department has been encouraging the transfers from National's DMS program. In Florida, we assign them to Post 400, and any post can authorize the automatic transfer to their post.

This allows direct transfers, transfers first that require proof of honorable active-duty service, and posts can opt-out of autotransfers altogether.

At the start of the year, there were 12,670 members in Post 400, currently, there are 12,857. Since the start of collecting data on membership stats this year (September 9th), there have been 2,844 transfers from Post 400. Of that, some districts have refrained from accepting these Legion members that are in Good Standing which in and of itself is perplexing.

Why would posts be reluctant to accept these Legionnaires? They are American Legion members, why are they shunned? There is a 1% variance of National's DMS members who will not be honorable discharged, but you're still checking every one of them.

Some state when asked: "I do not know them." Others claim: "I cannot be sure they are Honorably discharged."

Unfortunately, neither of these are valid answers. How can I say that? Do you know every veteran who walks through your front door at your post? Do you know every veteran you meet around town or at Publix and Lowe's? That answer is a big fat, NO!

What is it? Because every veteran that comes in your post is going to have their discharge checked, just like anyone from around town.

So now what is it? "I cannot be sure if a Post 400 is Honorable Discharged." Are you not checking those first three categories? This one is no different, except they are already in the Legion, and in Good Standing. I've taken all your excuses away, right? "No, because there are not any of these veterans around my post or my District?" Let's see how true that really is, as I have been told

I did a random district from one area that made that statement, let's just say their transfers are low for Post 400. I pulled (tediously) all the zip codes for that district. I discovered they had 974 Post 400's available, many were AD's (those count to goal now). Therefore their statement did not hold water. This one, like many other districts, needed help. You say, "yea, they were only around larger populated areas." No, they were scattered in both large and small-town/cities. But you cannot catch a fish without casting for them. Yes, it requires effort, and yes, some if now several will say no, but you must ask to get a no.

We started the year off promoting transfer

with the DMS Preemptive Strike as a Jump Start attempt for transfers, but few answered the call. Well, I will give credit where credit is due.

Great job to these post that stood out this

- · Post 219 with 269 transfers
- Post 35 with 179 transfers
- Post 63 with 78 transfers
- Post 347 with 79 transfers
- Post 4 with 50 transfers
- Post 117 with 98 transfers
- · Post 318 with 69 transfers
- · Post 152 with 103 transfers
- Post 334 with 50 transfers

District 6 had the most transfers, with 670, and this is why they finished top at 101.25%, as of June 5th's report. The DMS put them there, and it can do it for your Post and/or District, but you must embrace it this coming year.

Also, don't forget about Post 208 (Cyber Post), you can get transfers from them as well.

Thank you for all the effort and hard work, each and every post expended. This was a most challenging year, with so many problems with MyLegion, it caused many more hours to be dedicated to membership. Let's pray for next year to be lighter work. I thank you for all the welcoming wherever I traveled across the state, you're the greatest and many thanks.

And as part of the Program Review session, we'll also recognize three of our posts with the Outstanding Post Scouting Program Award! This award is bestowed upon Department of Florida posts with the most involvement in the Scouting program. Involvement can consist of both chartering BSA units, sponsoring the activities of BSA units, or both (see below). The three posts will receive a Department of Florida plaque that acknowledges this

achievement for display at the post. I will be there Friday and Saturday (18th and 19th), and if anyone would like some of my attention then, please reach out in advance and we can schedule a time to get together!

Chartering Versus Sponsoring A BSA unit.

The terms chartering and sponsoring of Scouting units are often used synonymously but are distinctly different. CHARTERING: Chartering...a formal charter between a Boy Scouts of America (BSA) council and a chartered organization (place of worship, school, veterans service organization or other community group) ...entitles the organization or group to conduct the Scouting program with adult leadership that they approve to accomplish its mutual objectives and to serve the organization's and community's youth and families. Having a charter with the BSA is very similar to being awarded a business franchise. TAL charters all its 55 Departments to deliver the American Legion programs. Each Department then

charters Posts to do the same. Similarly, the BSA charters 253 Councils nationwide to deliver its youth programs. The Councils then partner individually with Posts to jointly charter Scout units. This charter is renewed every year and is codified through an "Annual Unit Charter Agreement" which must be signed by the Post Commander. This agreement outlines the conditions under which the Post is to conduct and deliver its youth program through Scouting units. This chartering procedure supports an important legal relationship. SPONSORING: Sponsoring is the less formal support of a Scouting unit. It often involves donating money, providing opportunities to earn money, and allowing post property to be used for activities, Courts of Honor, service projects, or meetings without that formal agreement that a charter codifies. Posts can provide this type of support to as many Scouting units as it can reasonably handle. SUCCESSFUL AND ENGAGED AMERICAN LEGION POSTS BOTH **CHARTER AND SPONSOR BSA UNITS!**

This form can be used by anyone should they become aware of a veteran or veteran's family in need of any kind of help and it gives all of us the opportunity to reach out.

to our upcoming Convention in just a couple of weeks. Registration is still open for the 2-day Post Service Officer class and the application can be found on the Department website. Posts can now send two individuals so don't wait until the last minute because this class is filling up quickly.



With Memorial Day fast approaching, let us remember all our brothers and sisters who are no longer with us. I hope everyone finds peace and solace on this special day which started 151 years ago. I'm always reminded on how I can create a positive impact to the memories of my battle buddies no longer with me. Last September, I was fortunate to meet up with Jo Ann Maitland, American Gold Star Mothers National President, and Martin County's resident. After a zoom call in January, on how the American Legion can support the AGSM's National Convention this month from June 22-26, it was agreed by their Board members that a Standdown will be held on the 25th at the Hilton by the airport in West Palm Beach, the site of their convention.

Fast forward to today, along with Jo's husband, Frank Maitland, past 11th District Commander, we came up with a program based on AGSM's project of supporting our Homeless Veterans and Veterans in need. Along with the Vietnam Memorial, 9-11 First Responders, and Global War of Terrorism Walls being displayed at the hotel, the Woody Williams Memorial display, Wreaths Across America tractor/trailer, and a static display of military vehicles will be on site as well. Mission BBQ has graciously donated 200 meals that will be used to feed our Homeless Veterans. Food trucks will be available for our public. There will also be shower on wheels and barbers available to support.

More importantly, the VA will be on site to provide triage, enrollment, along with social workers and HUD-VASH representatives. They have also agreed to support the few that weren't Veterans that may come through that day. The Homeless Coalition and Palm Beach County Services will be there to support our non-veteran community. Service Officers will be available to assist our Veterans in beginning and/or completing their disability claims application process and other Veteran organizations will be available to support our Veterans in the communities in South Florida.

A golf tournament will be held at the Madison Green Country Club in Royal Palm Beach, the same day as the Standdown, where the proceeds will go to Stand Down, an initiative of Faith Hope Love Charity, Inc founded by Roy Foster, a Veteran himself. Throughout the year, where they may not have room at their facilities, they housed homeless Veterans in hotels in the county.

Other events during the Convention will be the arrival of the Walls on the 22nd, which will be set-up for the public to view 24/7 throughout the Convention, the Opening Ceremonies on Thursday, the 23rd, where several Veteran Organizations will be laying a wreath at the Vietnam Memorial Wall led by American Gold Star Mothers and the Vietnam Veterans of America (VVA). The AGSM Gala will be held Saturday evening, the 25th on the last night of the Convention.

We are looking for support from our Legion Riders to escort the Walls on June 22nd and volunteers to man the RV and assist the public which will be on site 24/7.
