Welcome to the start of the 2016-17 term of office. This year I have been elected to the office of Post Historian. I would like to thank everyone for their vote of confidence. Actually I have been performing some of the duties of this office by maintaining the Post website, www.AL233FL.org, for the past 8 years. Since I cannot be at all of the Post events, I ask other members if they would kindly take photos at these events and upload them to our Facebook page at www.facebook.com/groups/AL233FL/, thank you. This helps tremendously with maintaining our history.

Commander Dan Wortmann has appointed me his Judge Advocate for this term, and I will keep him abreast of any new Legion developments or changes that may take place during his tenure. As part of my duties I will also begin drafting some necessary changes/updates to our Post by-laws as required by Department, every three (3) years. These changes will be brought to the general meeting for review and passage.

This term I will again be wearing a couple of other 'hats' for the Legion.
