During the month of February I attended The Florida American Legion College. The FALC is a three day, intense instruction of different aspects of the American Legion. The class started with an overview of the History of The American Legion, the Legion Emblem and the Preamble. We were introduced to Resolutions and assigned temporary virtual Districts (5) for our assignment on Resolution Writing. Each District was responsible to present a written Resolution on the last day of class. We were given a tour of Department headquarters and were introduced to the staff and given a better understanding of their functions and duties.

On day two the course content included Parliamentary Procedure and Protocol, Leadership and Team Building, Legislative Priorities, Programs and Public Relations, Department Programs and Awards, Fundraising and Membership. Day two also consisted of Resolution Work Groups. These work groups continued at the hotel after dinner ("homework").

Our third day consisted of Post/District Election Procedures (DCC), Internal Affairs and the importance of CPR Consolidated Post Reports. In addition we were honored with the presence of the following instructors who spoke about their particular entities. The American Legion Auxiliary, Treva Kay Wildrick Department of Florida 1st Vice President; The Sons of The American Legion, Past National Commander James K. Roberts III; and the American Legion Riders, Jim Day Department of Florida ALR Chairman.

GOOD NEWS! We now have our number board working and our new blower arrived just in time to be used February 23<sup>rd</sup>.

In February, we had two of the best weeks since we began. Of course, the Canteen continues to benefit from our activities.

Our base of participation has been stable week to week and it allows us to be profitable. Furthermore, it allows us to make our players happy with our payouts. As I indicated, we gave out \$500 on February 2<sup>nd</sup>, \$650 on February 9<sup>th</sup> (with 37 Players), \$500 on February 16<sup>th</sup> and \$550 on February 23rd. As you may recall, we are allowed by Florida Statutes to pay out a maximum of \$50 for each of the first 5 games and \$250 for each of the jackpot games. Thus, in our current configuration, we can pay out a total of \$750. Let's keep the seats filled as we are about to reach our goal. Plus, a new Pull Tab Game will start next week. The winner of that game gets an amount equal to the payout in pull tabs. They could win a handsome sum.

On the 16<sup>th</sup>, one of our regular players by the name of Linda won not only the fifth game for \$50 but she did it with the Lucky Ball. She won an additional \$280! The Lucky Ball pool started again on the 23<sup>rd</sup> and builds until someone wins.

Most evenings begin with most people enjoying our light meal for a donation of \$3.00 and drinks from the Canteen. Once the games start, most everyone seem very quiet as they want to concentrate but soon the room comes alive and a party atmosphere takes over. By the time we play games six and seven, it becomes very loud

#### **Speed reduces your options:**

Every time your speed doubles, your stopping distance roughly quadruples. So, if you can stop in 50 feet from 30 mph, for example, at 60 mph, your stopping distance goes up to about 200 feet.
